For over 100 years Goshen Health has provided comprehensive health care close to home. Since its inception November 29, 1913, Goshen Health has grown from a 25 bed community hospital created to care for the sick and injured, to a health system that provides many specialty services, as well as preventative treatment options.

Goshen Health now includes a 122 bed hospital, Goshen Center for Cancer Care, Goshen Heart & Vascular Center, Goshen Home Care and Hospice, Goshen Home Medical Equipment, Goshen Orthopedic and Sports Medicine, Goshen Physicians Family Medicine & Urgent Care, Goshen Retreat Women's Health Center, Goshen Wound Center, Team:Bariatrics and Indiana Lakes Managed Care Organization. We are an award-winning health system recognized locally and nationally for innovation, excellence in patient care, and Colleague workplace satisfaction. Recently Goshen Health was ranked the 5th best hospital in Indiana.

We've come a long way from the small hospital on Fifth Street. Thoughtful contributions from people like you have enabled quality and growth of our medical care and services. Today treatments are approached proactively as we find new ways to engage in preventative care—whether through cancer research and clinical trials, or in-home telehealth monitoring. As the community's needs have changed, so has Goshen Health's approach to meeting those needs.

Your Community Hospital

When the need for 24-hour health care was realized by the Goshen community back in 1906, community members came together with a solution. They started a community-wide campaign to raise funds to open the first Goshen Hospital on Fifth Street in 1913, raising \$17,000. When hospital capacity was exceeded, the community came together again to raise more than \$1 million in 1955 to build a larger hospital. Then in 1982 the community raised another \$1.9 million to fund a new addition. While much has changed in health care over the years, partnership within the community has remained strong. Together we've expanded services, purchased new equipment, developed new treatments, and expanded the hospital as the community has grown. These efforts have enabled Goshen Health to continue providing cutting-edge technology and services, close to home.

CANCER TREATMENT

More than 15 years ago we

opened our own comprehensive, multi-disciplinary cancer center to bring world-class cancer treatment close to home. In 2014, we added a second location in Warsaw to meet the needs of those traveling for care.

Our dedicated team of research experts and oncologists are working to discover potential breakthrough therapies, medicines and cancer treatments, offering the latest clinical trials to patients and providing unmatched care in our region.



OBESITY

Offering both medically managed weight loss and bariatric surgery, our integrated system of support includes an entire team of weight

loss experts, a modern facility, on-site fitness center and dedicated specialists equipped with the most advanced research and technology.



TREATMENT OF CHRONIC DISEASES

Opened a comprehensive heart

and vascular care center allowing our board-certified cardiologists, surgeons, neurologists, and radiologists to work together in one place.

Remote STEMI Activation ambulance system implemented to better prepare hospital staff for a heart attack patient's arrival and treatment needs.

In-home telehealth monitors used to interact with patients, allowing clinical staff to provide timely care without the patient leaving home.



TOBACCO CESSATION

Led by a certified tobacco treatment

specialist, our program includes in-patient education and follow-up, out-patient sessions, school and community offerings, and a free, weekly support group. We focus on nicotine addiction and physical dependence, and mental and social aspects of tobacco use.



ACCESS TO CARE

Partnered with Maple City

Health Care Center to expand access to care through a community campaign that funded a second location, providing a medical home for an additional 1,200 patients in our community.


